



## Margaret Ann Moore

July 17, 1947 - December 6, 2020

Margaret Ann Moore, 73, passed from this earthly life the evening of Sunday, December 6, 2020, surrounded by family.

Maggie was born in Brady, Texas, to Harvey Clinton Pirtle and Lucile Slaughter Pirtle. She graduated Norman High School in 1965 and married Gary B. Moore on August 8, 1966, in Norman, Oklahoma. She had three children while they worked and lived in South Carolina. In 1978, the family packed up to move closer to family and settled in Granbury, Texas where they continued raising their children. Maggie worked many years for Granbury ISD as an elementary school secretary. She and Gary divorced in 1992. At the age of 45, she started college at Tarleton State University where she earned her nursing degree in 1994. Ann worked as an RN serving the people of Central Texas for more than 21 years at Goodall Witcher Hospital, then Hillcrest Hospital, and later for Baylor Scott & White Hospital in Temple, Texas.

Ann was a devout Christian and loved the Lord. She shared the gospel with her children, grandchildren, and those she came in contact with throughout her life even serving as a missionary in Afghanistan in early 2001. She was an ardent supporter for the Right to Life and served as a volunteer at Hope Pregnancy Center in Killeen, Texas. She was a member of Memorial Baptist Church and attended many years of Bible Study Fellowship classes pursuing God and exploring and discussing His Word in community with other women of faith. She was passionate about her faith, her country, and her family. Although life dealt her many struggles and personal difficulty, she leaned on Christ to give her strength in all things.
