



## Angela Rene Wilson

September 30, 1967 - February 16, 2025

Angela “Angie” Wilson, age 57, died in her sleep on the morning of Sunday, February 16th after a year of battling stomach cancer. She was surrounded by loved ones in her final days and at peace with how it ended, despite how deeply she will be mourned by those who lost her. She was able to impact many as a beloved teacher at multiple Texas schools, with her last, longest campus being Pflugerville High School where she taught her favorite subject, science, with a department that she loved teaching with and were amazing support to her as she underwent her cancer treatments. children. She started her teaching experience by homeschooling her children and became a resource in the community, teaching at co-ops and providing advice to any who asked her. She was always lifting up those around her however she could.

She enjoyed sci-fi and fantasy, and adored some TV shows that acted as comfort in her final months. She read or listened to books whenever she could, and kept many favorites on her phone, such as The Enchanted Forest Chronicles, that she first played for her children when they were small and came to listen to herself every night as she fell asleep decades later. She loved animals and always said she couldn't imagine living without a dog. All her dogs, from her first dog Peppy to her last to pass, Kylie, were precious to her, and their collars and pawprints were kept upon her mantle, where they will stay.

She will be sorely missed by everyone who was fortunate enough to know her. There will not be a funeral service, but those of who were close to her will keep her forever in their hearts. She is survived by her three children, Serra, Beth, and East, as well as her ex-husband Daren and his spouse, Michael.
