David Charles Penny, 63, of Thorndale, Texas, passed away on May 14, 2026, in Temple, Texas. Born on March 2, 1963, in Austin, Texas, David lived life in a way that made sure nobody ever had to wonder what he was thinking. If he loved you, you knew it. If he didn't, well... you probably knew that too. That honesty, humor, and stubborn streak were part of what made David unforgettable to everyone who knew him.

when heart complications finally forced him to slow down — though anyone who knew David knows slowing down was never really his style.

He was a man with a larger-than-life personality, a sharp sense of humor, and a heart bigger than he often let on. David could be stubborn, outspoken, and ornery, but he was also fiercely loyal to the people he loved. He showed up when it mattered most, especially for his children. Many remember seeing him sitting in church whenever his baby boy had something going on, and later in life David developed a personal relationship with his Savior that brought him peace and comfort.

David leaves behind countless memories, stories that will be retold for years, and a family who will miss his voice, his humor, and even his hard-headedness more than words can say.

A memorial service celebrating David's life will be held Friday, May 29th, at 10:30 a.m. at First Baptist Church in Thorndale, Texas.
