After retiring from the State, she devoted substantial time to prayer and reciting the rosary, reflecting her unwavering commitment to her faith and religion.

Linda's educational journey at Austin Community College began in the 1970s, marking the initial steps toward her pursuit of knowledge. However, it was in

2011, when she was in her late 50s, that Linda made a remarkable decision to return to ACC. Her motivation was clear: she aspired to become a personal trainer specializing in senior fitness. This career choice was deeply rooted in her passion for promoting fitness among the elderly, an advocacy she wholeheartedly believed in.

Having personally experienced the transformative power of fitness in her own life, Linda saw the immense potential it held for improving the well-being of seniors. Her decision to embark on this new journey exemplified her selflessness and dedication to the betterment of others. Linda's life was marked not only by her personal achievements but also by her unwavering commitment to putting the needs and health of others before her own. Her favorite pastime involved taking her children and grandchildren to thrift stores and local Goodwills, engaging in the simple pleasure of window shopping. Additionally, she indulged her creative side by crocheting beanie hats whenever time allowed.
