George C. Hawkins, 70 of Austin, died March 24 from complications of necrotizing fasciitis.

George graduated with a BA in Electrical Engineering from the University of Illinois, and an MBA in Business from the University of Chicago. George worked as a Design Engineer, Chief Engineer, and Member of the Technical Staff for Motorola from 1966-1998. George volunteered with the Motorola Patent Committee, Motorola Amateur Club, St. Catherine of Sienna, St. Mary's Cathedral, the Knights of Columbus, AMBIS, the Guaranty Fund Advisory Council, and the Austin Parrot Society.
