January 25, 1936 - July 20, 2025

On July 20, 2025, Mae Joyce Fields passed away peacefully at her home surrounded

by her loving family.

Mae was born on January 25, 1936, in Wills Point, Texas. She was the second child

and only daughter born to Grady Johnson and Marie (Lyons) Johnson. After the

early death of Mae's mother, Marie, Mae and her three brothers, Grady Jr, Billy

Joe, and L. C. (Lester Charles), moved to the home of their loving grandmother

(Martha Lyons) and grandfather (Sheppard Lyons). Her father, Grady, soon married Olether Johnson, and Mae was blessed with two sisters, Della Faye Holliness, Dorothy Pearl Johnson, and two younger brothers, Ernest Lee Johnson

and Robert Gene Johnson.

Mae spent her younger years in Terrell, Texas, and later in life, she moved to Dallas, Texas, where she met and fell in love with Samuel Fields. Mae and Samuel

celebrated 66 years of marriage on June 20, 2025. They cherished the life they

(Isaac), Samuel O'Hara (Ginyier), Michael Scott (Desma), and Roger Wayne. Everyone who knows "Sam and Mae" will tell you Sam is the talker, and Mae would occasionally smile while she listened.
