On Wednesday March 2, 2022 Michael Gayle Clark, loving husband, and father of four children passed away at age 82.

Mike was born March 16th, 1939 to Cleo and Laurel Clark in Lubbock TX where he attended Texas Tech University before serving his country in the US Navy. He is survived by his wife Perpetua, his four children, Michael, Diane, Clifton, Melinda, his grandchildren, Jake, Sydney, Mason, Joey, Collin, Lauren, Megan, his Great grandchild Emery, his brothers David, Bill and sister Beth.
