Pamela Kay Thomas Johnson, 62, of Morgan's Point Resort, passed away Saturday, Nov. 9, 2013, at Temple Living Center West. A memorial service will be at 2 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 23, at Foundation United Methodist Church in Temple.

Johnson was born Feb. 3, 1951, to William and Kathryn Thomas in Midland, Texas. She was the oldest of three children and a 1969 graduate of Robert E. Lee High School in Midland.
