



Reed Duncan Hamilton

October 13, 1945 - February 5, 2016

Hamilton, Reed Duncan, Jr., 70, born Brooklyn, NY, died February 5, 2016, in Austin, TX.

Raised in Mt. Vernon, OH, he graduated Mt. Vernon High School, 1963, a Star Scout and President of his class. He held a MS in Electrical Engineering from Cornell University, and served in the US Navy (Lieutenant) and the US Naval Reserve (Commander). He called Cleburne, TX, New Orleans, LA, and Ft. Worth, TX home. An avid bicyclist and runner, Reed enjoyed volunteering with the Boy Scouts of America, public speaking as a Toastmaster, and singing with the Unity Church choir.

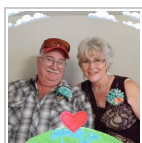
